

## WATERCOLOR SUPPLY LIST

- \* **Watercolor Paints--** Windsor & Newton and Van Gough make nice sets. Or get tubes and a palette to put them in . You'll need a warm and cool red, yellow, blue, green and a purple.
- \* **Watercolor Paper--** 140 lb. I like Windsor & Newton and Arches, but the Strathmore with the yellow cover will do to start with..
- \* **Brushes--** A #10 round. My favorite is Loew Cornell 7020 Ultra Rd. A ¾" or 1" flat. I like Utrecht 1162 sablette wash.
- \* **Pencil and Kneaded Eraser**
- \* **Sketch Book**
- \* **Water Container—**A big cup or bowl.
- \* **Paper Towels**
- \* **Spray Bottle—**An empty sample hairspray bottle is fine.
- \* **Brush Holder—**Something to protect those brush tips.
- \* **Sponge—**Small sea sponges are nice.
- \* **Permanent Felt Tipped Pen—**An extra fine Sharpie is fine.
- \* **Masking Tape**
- \* **Drawing Board—**A board with a clip is nice.
- \* **Exacto Knife**
- \* **Toothbrush**
- \* **White Crayon or Candle**
- \* **A Bag—**To put supplies in. It should be big enough to hold your pad of paper. You may want to get one big enough to accommodate a bigger pad of paper for future classes.
